## **To celebrate the 150th Anniversary of Muskegon County, we are pleased to offer History Cruises on the Port City Princess**

Join us for a very special narrated Historical Cruise on the Port City Princess.

Planned and narrated by local historians, including Dr. Dan Yakes—former Professor of History at MCC, expert on Muskegon History, and noted local author.

**Cruise #1** will feature sites that would have been prominent during the 1880s and 1890s, such as sawmills in Bluffton, Lakeside, Bluffton, Muskegon, North Muskegon, and Bay Mills, as well as Pigeon Hill and the Life Saving Station at the channel and the log sorting grounds at the mouth of the Muskegon River.

**Cruise #2** will feature sites that would have been prominent during the 1920s and 1930s, such as Lake Michigan Park, the destruction of Pigeon Hill, the Life Saving Station, the Muskegon Country Club, the Goodrich dock, Union Station, Occidental Hotel and other buildings in Muskegon, Custer Park and the site of the Jackson Hotel in North Muskegon.
